

ATLAS ARENA SPORT AND ENTERTAINMENT HALL REGULATIONS

§ 1

The Atlas Arena Sports and Entertainment Hall in Łódź (hereinafter also referred to as the "Hall" or the "Facility") is managed by Miejska Arena Kultury i Sportu Sp. z o.o. (MAKiS) with its registered office in Łódź, al. Bandurskiego 7, entered in the Register of Entrepreneurs of the National Court Register kept by the District Court for Łódź Śródmieście in Łódź, XX Division of the National Court Register, under KRS no. 000033168, NIP 727-27-46-177 and REGON: 100694548, share capital of PLN 19,011,000.00 (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Arena Operator" or the "Operator"), on the basis of the lease agreement of the Łódź Sports Centre no. DGM-MM-VI.6845 .279.2015 of 27 October 27, 2015, concluded between the Operator and the City of Łódź – Department of City Assets in the Asset Management Department based in Łódź.

§ 2

1. These Rules and Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the "Hall Rules") set out the rules of the Atlas Arena Sports and Entertainment Hall at al. Bandurskiego 7, hereinafter referred to as the "Hall" or the "Facility", in particular the rules of staying in the Hall and using the Hall.
2. The hall is a facility for the organisation of events, including mass events, as well as for recreational, commercial and service activities, including office, parking and catering on its premises.
3. All persons present in the Hall are obliged to strictly abide by the provisions of the Hall Regulations.
4. Entering the Hall constitutes acceptance and consent to abide by the provisions of the Hall Regulations.
5. The rules of making the Hall available to participants of mass events and other events organised in the Hall are defined by the relevant regulations and instructions, issued in addition to the Hall Regulations.
6. The provisions of these Hall Rules and Regulations shall apply, unless otherwise specified in the provisions of contracts concluded with entities to which the Operator has subleased, leased or granted the Hall for use without charge, or in the provisions of any regulations or instructions in force during mass events or other events.

§ 3

1. The Hall is available for visitors daily from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. with the exception of days on which mass events or other events are organised.
2. Admission to the Hall of a minor under 13 years of age is permitted only in the care of an adult person.
3. There are restricted access areas within the Hall, which may only be entered by persons with appropriate identification. Outside restricted access zones, movement in the Hall is permitted without restrictions, subject to sections 4 and 5 below.
4. In the area of the Hall, pedestrian and vehicle traffic may only take place on roads designated for this purpose. Parking of vehicles is allowed only in places designated for that purpose and in a place resulting from a permission issued by the Operator or additionally by the Lessee.
5. It is forbidden to enter areas not designated for the public without permission from the Operator. This prohibition applies in particular:
 - a) the main pitch;
 - b) the warm-up area;
 - c) the office area;
 - d) structures, rooms and equipment not designated for general public USE, the arena facade, fences, walls, fences, arena roofs, lighting equipment, camera platforms, trees, all types of masts, and entry to other places, equipment and premises to which access is restricted to specialist services or representatives of the Operator.
6. It is forbidden to take photographs of the Hall for commercial purposes without the prior consent of the Operator.
7. A map of the Hall area is attached to the Hall Regulations.

§ 4

1. The hall is monitored by video surveillance cameras 24 hours a day.
2. The Hall is protected 24 hours a day.
3. Persons staying in the Hall are obliged to carry and visibly display an ID or accreditation received from the Operator or the Organiser of events taking place in the Hall. The Operator and its services have the right to check received accreditations and badges. The Operator may impose a contractual penalty for lack of ID or accreditation, referred to in § 7.2.c).

4. In the event of loss, damage or any other circumstances of loss of ID or accreditation, this fact should be immediately reported to the Operator of the Arena.
5. The original accreditation or badge shall be issued free of charge. Issuance of duplicate documents is possible after an administrative fee of PLN 50 has been paid.
6. A specimen accreditation document and badge, the manner of applying for their issue and the process of their distribution shall be specified by the Operator of the Hall in a statement sent to entities to which the Operator has given the Hall for sublease, lease or free use.
7. Detailed method of behaviour at events held in the Hall shall be determined by the Organisers of such events, with particular regard to these Hall Rules, as well as the act on the safety of mass events and fire safety regulations, and in compliance with the law in force.
8. The responsibility for the use of sports equipment and facilities located in the Hall lies with the users, who are obliged to use them in accordance with their purpose and safety conditions.
9. Everyone present in the Hall is obliged to behave in accordance with generally accepted rules of personal culture, with particular attention to safety and comfort of others.
10. Everyone staying in the Hall should abide by the orders of the police, fire brigade, municipal police, the Organiser's security services, the Hall Operator, or the instructions given by the event announcer.
11. All entrances and exits, as well as escape routes, must be kept clear, allowing for quick and collision-free evacuation.

§ 5

1. It is forbidden to enter the Hall area to a person:
 - a. Under the visible influence of alcohol, intoxicants and psychotropic drugs or other similarly acting agents;
 - b. Behaving aggressively, provocatively or otherwise posing a threat to public safety or order.
2. It is forbidden to bring and possess in the Hall without the consent of the Hall Operator:
 - a. Any weapons;
 - b. Pyrotechnic products and other similarly acting items, as well as all types of potentially fire hazardous materials;
 - c. Alcohol
 - d. Narcotics and psychotropic drugs or other similarly acting agents;
 - e. Containers for spraying gas, corrosive substances or dyes
 - f. Advertising materials.
3. It is prohibited to:
 - a. Consume alcohol (except in places designated for this purpose or where the contract provides otherwise), use narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances;
 - b. Light and stoke fires and smoke tobacco (except in designated areas)
 - c. Use pyrotechnics, etc. The use of pyrotechnic and fire-hazardous materials as an additional means of expression of an organised event is permitted only after obtaining the consent of the City Headquarters of the State Fire Brigade in Łódź or the fire brigade which the Hall is within the operational range of;
 - d. Place inscriptions, graffiti and stickers;
 - e. Perform physiological needs outside the toilets, litter the area of the Hall, and damage the infrastructure of the Hall;
 - f. Unjustifiably block entrances, exits and escape routes in the Hall;
 - g. Enter or pass through structures and equipment not intended for public use, especially locked gates, to light equipment, camera and announcer platforms, masts, etc;
 - h. Enter areas that are not permitted for spectators – interior rooms, service rooms, etc;
 - i. Enter the Venue with motor vehicles, electric vehicles and bicycles without the consent of the Organiser;
 - j. Introduce and bring in dogs and other animals;
 - k. Use caps, chimney sweeps and other accessories which make identification of a person difficult;
 - l. Throw any objects;
 - m. Trade, distribute printed materials, leaflets, and collect money or goods without the consent of the Operator;
 - n. Write, paint, tape walls, equipment, etc;
 - o. Place any advertising.

§ 6

1. Commercial and service activities in the Hall may only be carried out on the basis of the relevant agreements concluded with the Hall Operator.

2. Commercial and service activities in the Hall may only be carried out during the Hall's opening hours (§3.1), unless otherwise specified in the agreement concluded with the Hall Operator.
3. The entity conducting business activity in the Hall is obliged to:
 - a. Mark their places of business in accordance with the provisions of law;
 - b. Possess the appropriate documents authorising it to the conduct business activity, together with the required permits;
 - c. Maintain cleanliness, hygiene and aesthetics of the workplace;
 - d. Maintain unobstructed passageways in accordance with applicable health, safety and fire safety regulations
 - e. Not to place announcements and advertisements outside the places agreed with the Operator;
 - f. Observe the rules of social coexistence;
 - g. Conduct their business in a manner that does not cause a nuisance to the surrounding area, particularly in terms of noise, odour, general aesthetics, etc;
 - h. Comply with fire and health and safety regulations, rules and instructions.

§ 7

1. The Operator reserves the right, in relation to persons not observing the Rules and Regulations of the Hall and the law in the Hall, to:
 - a. Remove them from the Arena;
 - b. Impose a regulatory penalty;
 - c. Pursuing claims for damage caused;
 - d. Claims for violation of his/her good name.
2. Regulatory penalties for violations of the rules set forth by these Hall Rules:
 - a. For entering the arena without the consent and supervision of the Operator – PLN 1000;
 - b. For entering or moving about the facility in areas to which access has not been granted: in the case of the first violation – a warning, in the case of recidivism – PLN 500;
 - c. For lack of accreditation or badge: in case of first violation – warning, in case of repetition – PLN 100;
 - d. For parking a motor vehicle on the premises of the Hall outside designated places: in the case of a first violation – a warning, in the case of repeat offences – PLN 100;
 - e. For other breaches of the Regulations of the Arena not covered by the regulations of the mass event: in case of the first breach – a warning, in case of repetition – PLN 100.

§ 8

In the case of organising events on the premises of the Hall, the Organiser of the event is obliged to observe and enforce the provisions of these Hall Regulations and other current legal regulations resulting from the type and scope of the event, including e.g. the Act on Security of Mass Events.

§ 9

1. The Arena Operator reserves the right to unilaterally amend the Hall Rules and Regulations at any time.
2. Any appendices to these Hall Rules and Regulations, in particular regulations and instructions for specific events, including mass events, as well as regulations or instructions for use of parking spaces, etc., are its integral part.
3. The Hall Regulations are available at entrances to the Hall, and at the secretary's office of the Hall Operator.
4. Consent to the provisions of the Regulations of the Hall means consent to the provisions of the appendices.
5. The administrator of Personal Data from video surveillance is Miejska Arena Kultury i Sportu Sp. z o.o. (MAKiS) with its seat in Łódź (94-020), al. Bandurskiego 7.
